Dear Church Family,

Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his faithful servants. Truly I am your servant, Lord; ... you have freed me from my chains.

Psalm 116: 15&16

These verses have had a special resonance for me this last week in reflecting on the death of Ron Davison.

They remind me that our very existence matters to God; that when our death comes it is a precious thing to God, the culmination of all that we have been and done during our 'earthly pilgrimage'.

The Psalmist speaks of having been freed from his chains. Freedom can be thought of in different ways - freedom from literal oppression and enslavement or from enslaving habits or attitudes; freedom from the chains of fear or a crippling sense of not being good enough.

Of course it is God who does the freeing, the breaking of chains.

So we ask that God may continue to set people free, to release us from all the ways we are held captive.
